OPPORTUNITIES FOR ALL


We are a voluntary Civil Defence (Emergency Support) Organisation focused on supporting communities and emergency services in times of need.

You can choose to specialise in one of over 40 roles and be part of a close-knit team. Together you will train and take part in activities to overcome challenging situations whilst developing skills and creating memorable experiences. We welcome all adults no matter your abilities and interests.

It's our aim to have training and exercises which are motivating fun and inspiring. These activities will teach you the skills and confidence to step up and make a difference in our wider community. As a team, we'll be called upon to assist in situations such as those caused by adverse weather, a collapsed building, or evacuations.


Our roles range from being a medic to IT and social media support to catering. We're exceptionally versatile and have opportunities to suit different types of experience and interests.

We need good people to help develop the Corps to its full potential, and so are looking for people from all backgrounds and all levels of abilities. No previous military or emergency service experience is required as our aim is to train all volunteers to suit their chosen speciality. If you have got relevant experience in any of our specialties, then you may wish to consider applying for a position as an instructor or specialist officer.

VOLUNTEER IN THE CIVIL AID VOLUNTEER CORPS (CAVC)

This is our primary membership from which individuals can earn recognition and promotion and open to all.

INSTRUCTOR IN THE CIVIL AID VOLUNTEER (CAVC)

These are roles suited to individuals who do have experience in either the emergency services or military, who can bring experience to the Corps and be role models to volunteers.

OFFICER IN THE CIVIL AID VOLUNTEER CORPS (CAVC)

Being responsible for units of adult volunteers; these roles are particularly strong in leadership and team building. Development and encouragement are at the forefront of the Corps' purpose and the development of volunteers is as paramount as the progression of the cadets. Organisational skills are equally prominent for this role.



CO-ORDINATOR/VOLUNTEER IN THE COMMUNITY RESILIENCE Volunteers (CRVs)

These are our Foundation Members. As residents within their area, their local knowledge, advice, and assistance will be paramount to supporting the operational elements of the Corps and professional services. The commitment is less than that expected from operational members, but more than Neighbourhood Watch.
